**Constitutional Amendment Question**

Explanatory statement. The Value Them Both Amendment would affirm there is no Kansas constitutional right to abortion or to require the government funding of abortion, and would reserve to the people of Kansas, through their elected state legislators, the right to pass laws to regulate abortion, including, but not limited to, in circumstances of pregnancy resulting from rape or incest, or when necessary to save the life of the mother. A vote for the Value Them Both Amendment would affirm there is no Kansas constitutional right to abortion or to require the government funding of abortion, and would reserve to the people of Kansas, through their elected state legislators, the right to pass laws to regulate abortion. A vote against the Value Them Both Amendment would make no changes to the constitution of the state of Kansas, and could restrict the people, through their elected state legislators, from regulating abortion by leaving in place the recently recognized right to abortion.” Shall the following be adopted?

Q § 22. Regulation of abortion. Because Kansans value both women and children, the constitution of the state of Kansas does not require government funding of abortion and does not create or secure a right to abortion. To the extent permitted by the constitution of the United States, the people, through their elected state representatives and state senators, may pass laws regarding abortion, including, but not limited to, laws that account for circumstances of pregnancy resulting from rape or incest, or circumstances of necessity to save the life of the mother

**VOTER REGISTRATION**

You may register to vote at any of the following locations during their regular business hours: the Office of the County Clerk, Courthouse, Woodson, or online [www.woodsoncounty.net](http://www.woodsoncounty.net) ; any city clerk’s office, Piqua Rural Water office, Department of Motor Vehicles, US Mail(request Kansas Voter Registration Application by mail or telephone); also available in Online registration-follow thru as directed.

A citizen of the United State who is eighteen (18) years of age and upwards or will have attained the age of eighteen (18) years at the next election, must register before he or she may vote.

When a voter has been registered according to law his or her registration shall continue to be valid until one or the following occurs:

1. The Voter changes residence outside of his/her voting precinct boundary.
2. The Voter fails to vote in two consecutive state general elections.

If either of the above occurs, you must re-register. Any person may apply in person or by mail to the County Election Officer to re-register.

The application shall be signed under penalty of perjury.

**CLOSING OF REGISTRATION BOOKS**

Pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 2502311, notice is hereby given that on the 12<sup>th</sup> of July 2022 (last day to register to vote before the August Primary) all registration books for the National/State/County/Local Primary Election will close at the end of regular business hours/day. The books will remain closed until the day following the Primary Election, August 2, 2022.

**ADVANCE VOTING BY MAIL: KSA 25-1123**

Any registered voter is eligible to vote by Advance Ballot beginning Wednesday, July 13, 2022 (20 days prior to said Primary Election) thru Monday Noon August 1, 2022. Applications for Advance Ballots are available at the Woodson County Clerk/Election Office or by calling (620) 625-8605 Ext. 9.
