

The Board of Woodson County Commissioners met in a regular business session on April 28th, 2020 at 1:00 p.m. with Chairman Forsyth, Vice Chairman Yoho, Member Barnett, County Attorney Schlotterbeck and County Clerk Porter.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by Yoho, Barnett, Forsyth, and Porter.

Yoho moved to approve the agenda as amended. Barnett seconded the motion with Forsyth making it unanimous.

Barnett moved to approve the April 21st, 2020 minutes as printed. Yoho seconded the motion with Forsyth making it unanimous.

County Attorney Schlotterbeck discussed Resolution 20-05, a resolution temporarily amending the Woodson County employee handbook to respond to COVID-19. Barnett made the motion to adopt Resolution 20-05. Yoho seconded the motion with Forsyth making it unanimous.

Yoho made the motion to open the Courthouse to the public effective Monday, May 4th, 2020. Barnett seconded the motion with Forsyth making it unanimous.

Yates Center Health Department reported 5 total cases of the COVID-19; 4 of those cases have recovered, and 1 case is still in the hospital.

The Board discussed County employees need continuous training with Emergency Preparedness. Representative Bartlett agreed to look into different training programs.

Barnett moves we recess into executive session for non-elected personnel to protect employee confidentiality; to discuss employee performance for 10 minutes with Commissioners, County Attorney, County Clerk and Public Works Supervisor Onnen at 1:52 p.m.; reconvene at 2:02 a.m. in the District Courtroom. Yoho seconded the motion with Forsyth making it unanimous.

Barnett made the motion to restructure the Noxious Weed Department, Solid Waste Department, Road and Bridge Department due to COVID-19. Public Works Supervisor Onnen will be over all three departments. Yoho seconded the motion with Forsyth making it unanimous.

Noxious Weed McVey and Solid Waste Supervisor McCormick were advised by the Board the restructure of both departments under the supervision of the Public Works Supervisor Onnen due to the COVID-19.

Sheriff Campbell discussed with the Board that he had spoken to Bill Hartwig regarding the bull pen with vehicles and the process it will take to move those vehicles.


Board received resignation of Robert Clark for Toronto Township Trustee.


Barnett made the motion to pay vouchers for the amount of \$163,896.12. Yoho seconded the motion with Forsyth making it unanimous.
